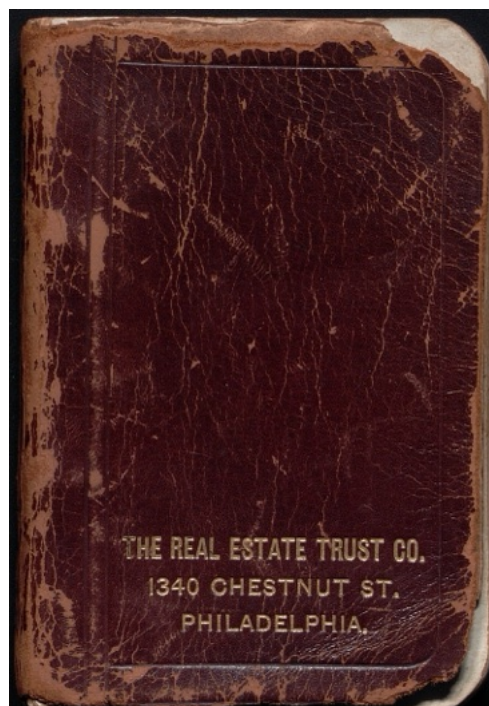

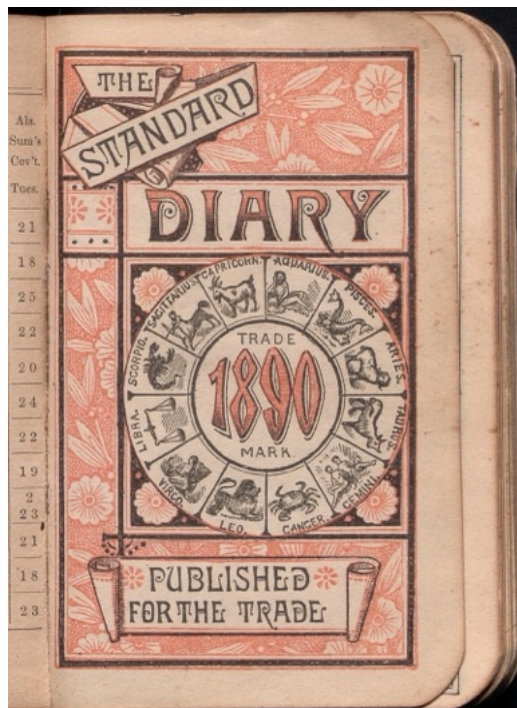

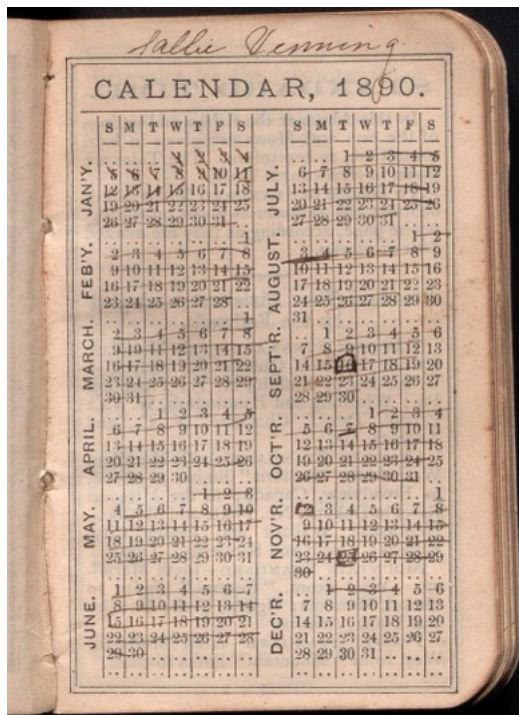

STANDARD TIME.

IN this Almanac the risings and settings of the Sun and Moon are given in local mean time, as heretofore. The Tides are given in STANDARD TIME.

To change to STANDARD TIME add or subtract the *minutes* as given on the opposite page, according as they are marked *plus* or *minus*.

Standard Time Divisions as adopted by the Railroads.

EASTERN STANDARD—75th Meridian. Canada, between Quebec and Detroit,—U. S., east of Buffalo, N. Y.; Pittsburg, Pa.; Wheeling and Huntington, W. Va.; Bristol, Tenn.; Charlotte, N. C., and Augusta, Ga.

CENTRAL STANDARD—90th Meridian. West from "Eastern" limits, as above, to Broadview, Canada; to the Missouri River in Dakota; No. Platte and McCook, Nebraska; Wallace and Dodge City, Kansas; Toyah and Sanderson, Texas.

MOUNTAIN STANDARD—105th Meridian. West from "Central" limits to Heron, Montana; Ogden, Utah; Needles and Yuma, Arizona.

PACIFIC STANDARD—120th Meridian. West from "Mountain" limits to coast.

RATES OF POSTAGE.

POSTAL CARDS, 1 cent each, go without further charge to all parts of the United States and Canada. Cards for foreign countries (within the Postal Union) 2 cents each. POSTAL CARDS are *unmailable* with any writing or printing on the address side, except the direction, or with anything pasted upon or attached to them.

ALL LETTERS, to all parts of the United States and Canada, 2 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof.

LOCAL, or "DROP" LETTERS, that is, for the city or town where deposited, 2 cents where the carrier system is adopted, and 1 cent where there is no carrier system.

FIRST CLASS.—Letters and all other written matter, *whether sealed or unsealed*, and all other matter *sealed, mailed, sewed, tied, or fastened in any manner* so that it cannot be easily examined, 2 cents for each ounce or fraction thereof.

SECOND CLASS.—Only for publishers and news agents; 1 cent per pound.

NEWSPAPERS and Periodicals (regular publications) can be mailed by the public at the rate of 1 cent for each 4 ounces or fraction thereof.

THIRD CLASS.—Printed matter in *unsealed wrappers only* (all matter inclosed in notched envelopes must pay letter rates), 1 cent for each 2 ounces or fraction thereof, *which must be fully prepaid*. This includes books, circulars, chromos, engravings, handbills, lithographs, music, pamphlets, proof-sheets and manuscript accompanying the same, reproductions by the electric pen, heliograph, metallograph, papyrograph, and, in short, any reproduction upon paper by any process *except hand-writing and the copying press*. Limit of weight 4 lbs., except for a single book, which may weigh more.

FOURTH CLASS.—All mailable matter not included in the three preceding classes which is so prepared for mailing as to be *easily withdrawn from the wrapper* and examined. Rate, 1 cent per ounce or fraction thereof. Limit of weight, 4 lbs. Full prepayment compulsory.

REFORWARDING.—Letters will be forwarded from one post office to another upon the *written* request of the *person addressed*, without additional postage charge; but unclaimed packages *cannot be returned to the sender* until stamps are furnished to pay the return postage.

RATES OF POSTAGE.

POSTAL NOTES.

Upon payment of a fee of 3 cents each, Postal Notes for any amount under Five Dollars may be purchased at any Money-order Office, payable to bearer at any time within three calendar months from the last day of the month during which it was issued; but payable *only* at such Money-order Office as the purchaser may select or at the office of issue.

FOREIGN POSTAGE.

The rates for letters are for the half ounce or fraction thereof, and those for newspapers for 2 ounces or fraction thereof:—

To Great Britain and Ireland, France, Spain, all parts of Germany, including Austria, Denmark, Switzerland, Italy, Russia, Norway, Sweden, Turkey (European and Asiatic), Egypt, letters 5 cents, newspapers 1 cent for each two ounces or fraction thereof.

To Australia, letters, via San Francisco (except to New South Wales), 5 cents; via Brindisi, 15 cents; newspapers, via San Francisco, 2 cents; via Brindisi, 4 cents. China, letters, via San Francisco, 5 cents; via Brindisi, 15 cents. 4 cents for each paper not weighing over 4 ounces. British India, Italian mail, letters, 5 cents, newspapers 1 cent for 2 ounces. Japan, letters, via San Francisco 5 cents, newspapers 1 cent for 2 ozs.

MORNING AND EVENING STARS.

MERCURY will be Evening Star about Jan. 13, May 6, Sept. 3, and Dec. 27; and Morning Star about Feb. 23, June 24, and Oct. 15.

VENUS will be Morning Star till Feb. 18; then Evening Star till Dec. 3; and Morning Star again the rest of the year.

JUPITER will be Evening Star till Jan. 10; then Morning Star till July 30; and Evening Star again the rest of the year.

ECLIPSES IN THE YEAR 1890.

In the year 1890 there will be three Eclipses; two of the Sun and one of the Moon, and a Lunar Appulse.

A LUNAR APPULSE, June 2-3. The Moon being visible to North and South America, and adjacent Oceans.

Angle of Position of point of nearest approach from north point of the Moon's limb 167 degrees to west. The nearness of the approach and the uncertainty as to the effect of the earth's atmosphere, render it doubtful whether the Moon will enter the shadow of the earth, (causing a partial eclipse,) or not.

I. AN ANNULAR ECLIPSE OF THE SUN, June 17. Invisible. Visible to Europe, Asia, northern half of Africa, eastern extremity of South America, and the intermediate Atlantic Ocean.

II. A SLIGHT PARTIAL ECLIPSE OF THE MOON, November 26. Invisible east of Dakota. Visible to the western part of North America, Asia, Australia, and the Pacific Ocean.

III. A CENTRAL ECLIPSE OF THE SUN, December 12. Invisible. Visible to Australia, the Indian Ocean, and around the South Pole.
